

Harvest Season Is Cider Time

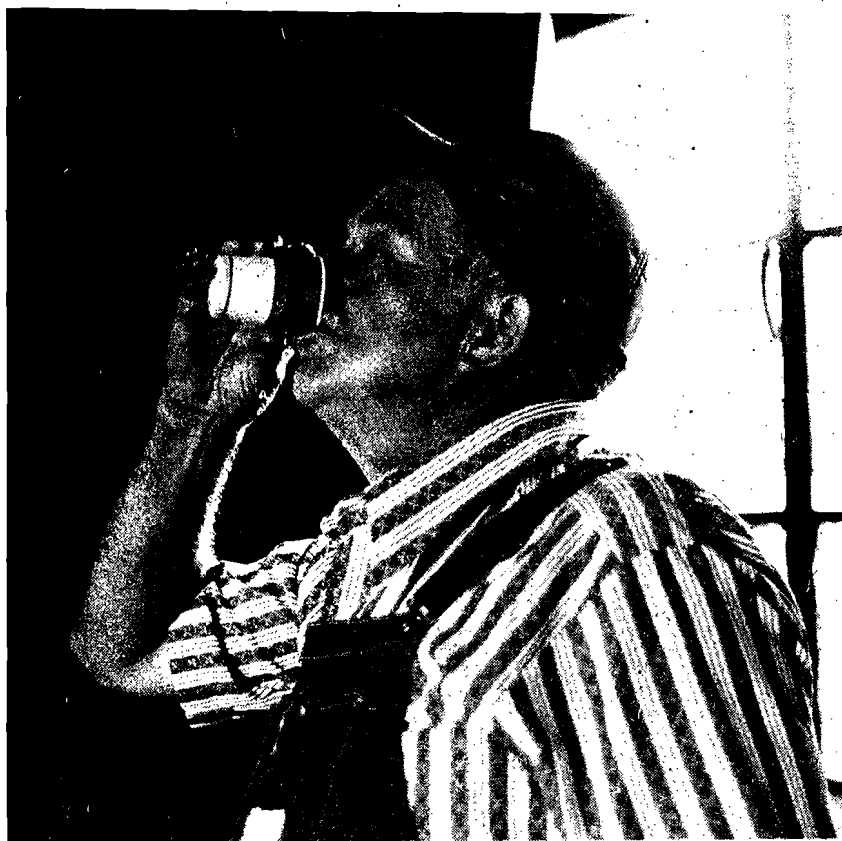
At The Old Butterhof Farm



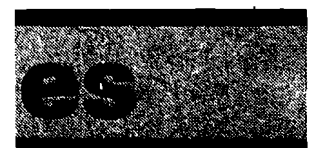
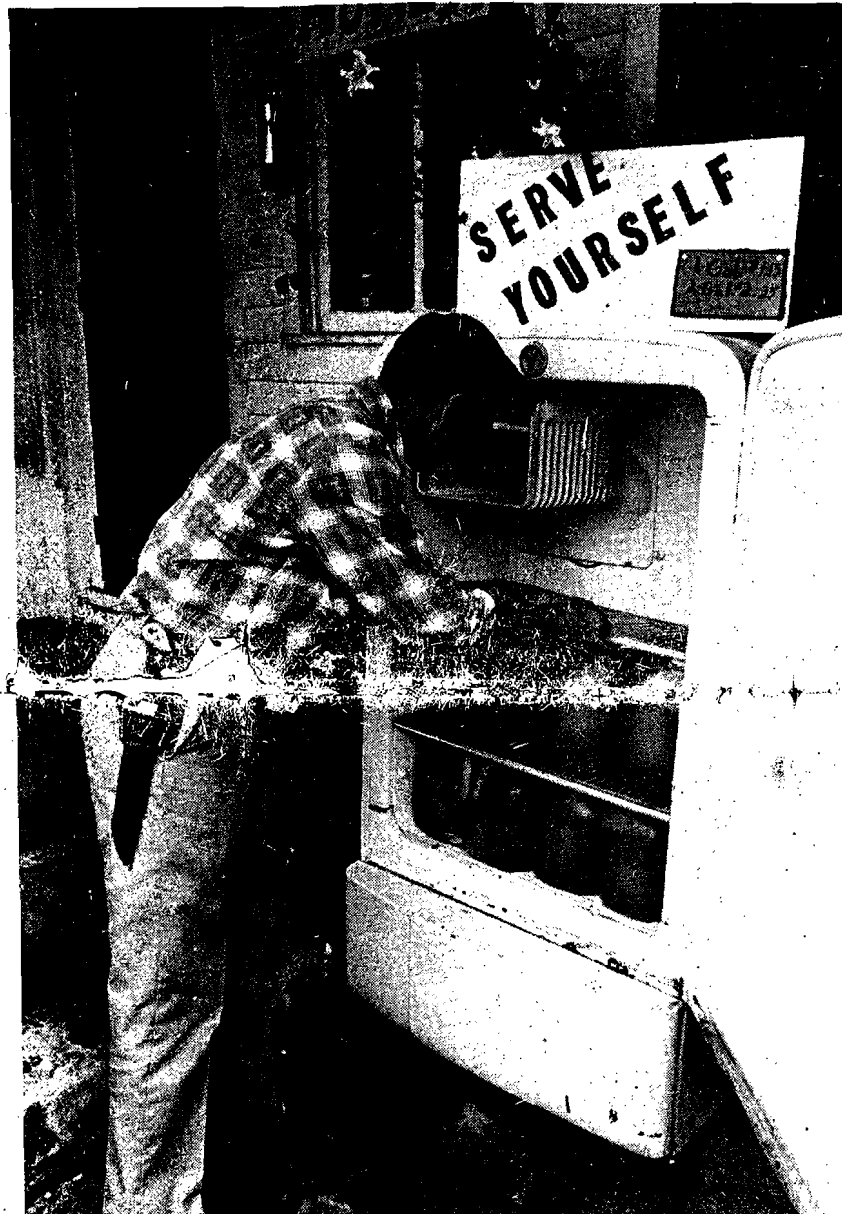
LEFT: Anna Butterhof inspects and sorts the apples as they drop into an elevator which sends them to the cider mill.
